Humanities & Social Sciences Courses

The McBride program fulfills all of the CSM Humanities & Social Science requirements except:

- LAIS100: Nature & Human Values: prerequisite for McBride courses
- EGBN201: Principles of Economics: required for all CSM students
- LAIS200: Human Systems: waived for McBride Students

If a student is admitted to McBride but has not yet taken NHV, the student may be able to take NHV concurrently with the first McBride seminar. Doing so will require the approval of the program director. EGBN201 is not a prerequisite for McBride, but the course must be completed prior to graduation to fulfill CSM requirements.
